

The City of Portland Announces Airport Deputy Director, Operations & Maintenance

PORTLAND, ME – Barry Brown has been named the new Airport Deputy Director, Operations & Maintenance for the Portland International Jetport (PWM), a commercial service airport encompassing 806 acres. It is the busiest airport in the state of Maine and recognized by the FAA as a small hub airport.

In this new role, Mr. Brown is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Portland International Jetport, directly supervising the Airfield Construction and Maintenance Manager and the Assistant Airport Operations Managers. He is also responsible for all Airport Maintenance and Operations personnel and has auditing and overall compliance oversight of Part 139 including but not limited to ARFF, Wildlife, Snow and Ice Control Plan, and Security. Mr. Brown began his new position on January 22, 2018.
