




Clearly, Charlottesville comes to life when those first dogwoods break into bloom. You can't help but enjoy the beauty this season.

THE AIRPORT

Close, Convenient, Connected. That is the Charlottesville Albemarle Airport (CHO), a non-hub, commercial service airport offering daily non-stop flights around the U.S. to 6 different hub destinations. Served by American Eagle, Delta Connection, United Express, and US Airways Express, CHO had another record year serving over 450,000 passengers with over 81,000 operations. Corporate and general aviation aircraft are well served by the airport's FBO, Landmark Aviation.

CHO is governed by the three member Charlottesville Albemarle Airport Authority (Authority). A seven member Joint Airport Commission (Commission) serves as an advisory group to the Airport Authority & the Community.

Located just north of City of Charlottesville, CHO is responsible for over \$129 million in economic activity for the area. The airport has 32 employees. For FY13 the airport has an operational budget of \$4.6 million and a capital budget of \$9.5 million. The airport is in the middle of an 800' runway extension project with a completion price tag of around \$42 million.

Are you a creative, energetic airport executive with excellent communication skills? CHO provides this unique opportunity for an exceptional, proactive leader that combines diplomacy with consensus building in developing and managing a participatory, teamoriented work environment.

The Executive Director serves as the chief executive officer, responsible for the overall management and administration of CHO. The Executive Director plans, directs, and coordinates the work of staff personnel and administers policies and directives of the Authority. This position reports directly to the Authority Board of Directors.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate possesses an extensive knowledge of the principles and practices of modern airport management which has been acquired through verifiable work experience and education. The candidate will have demonstrated extensive and varied airport administration experience with strong leadership skills, solid interpersonal relationship skills, and strong business acumen.

The ideal candidate must have a proven track record as a persuasive communicator exhibiting a high level of diplomacy whether interacting with the staff, the Board, the Commission, the community, the media, or high levels of local, state or federal officials. Hands-on experience in working with local, state, and especially, federal officials and politicians pursuing financial support for your airport is a must. The ideal candidate will have a proven record of earning the respect and trust of others.

Bachelor's degree required in Airport Management, Business Administration or closely related field. MBA is desirable. To be considered, you will be employed as an airport executive with at least ten (10) years progressive experience in the airport management industry.
