About The Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority

The Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority was founded in 1955 as the first port authority established in the state of Ohio. The Port Authority's business is transportation and development, and that business is shaped by our mission to move people and cargo through the region while employing innovative programs to stimulate economic development in our region.

The Port of Toledo is home to 15 terminals and is the largest landmass seaport on the Great Lakes. The seaport alone supports \$669 million in economic activity and more than 7,000 jobs in our region. The Port Authority manages the Eugene F. Kranz Toledo Express Airport (TOL) and Toledo Executive Airport (TDZ) and owns the Toledo Train Station, also known as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Plaza, as well as three office buildings and three parking garages in downtown Toledo.

The Port Authority's financing programs have assisted over 600 economic development projects representing a total investment of more than \$2 billion, while helping to create and retain over 20,000 jobs. The Port Authority is also involved in brownfield remediation, acquiring old industrial brownfield sites and returning them to the stream of commerce, while creating jobs and economic opportunities for the region.

About The Airports

The Eugene F. Kranz Toledo Express Airport (TOL), owned by the City of Toledo, opened its doors in 1955 and has been managed by the Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority since 1973. TOL offers nonstop service to Phoenix-Mesa, Arizona, and Orlando Sanford, Ft. Myers/Punta Gorda and St. Pete-Clearwater, Florida via Allegiant; and nonstop service to Chicago, Illinois, as well as one-stop service to more than 100 worldwide destinations when connecting through Chicago, via American Airlines.

The airport's primary runway has a length of 10,599 feet and a 24/7 staffed Air Traffic Control Tower and TRACON. TOL is home to over 20 on-airport businesses including the Ohio Air National Guard's 180th Fighter Wing and an Amazon Air Toledo Gateway, which launched operations in March 2020. Various corporate hangars, aircraft maintenance facilities and air cargo operations are located at TOL, in addition to three fixed-base operators and one ground handler. Toledo Public Schools' Aerospace & Natural Science Academy of Toledo is located at TOL, as well as the Federal Aerospace Institute adult aircraft maintenance technician school, making TOL a regional leader in aviation education. In addition, an update to the Airport Master Plan is currently underway, which will address the Airport's capital improvement plan, land use plan, and terminal improvements.

Toledo Executive Airport (TDZ) is a general aviation airport located 15 minutes from downtown Toledo and 25 minutes from TOL. TDZ hangars both private and corporate-owned aircraft, is home to several aviation businesses, and offers an array of aircraft services, including fuel and maintenance.

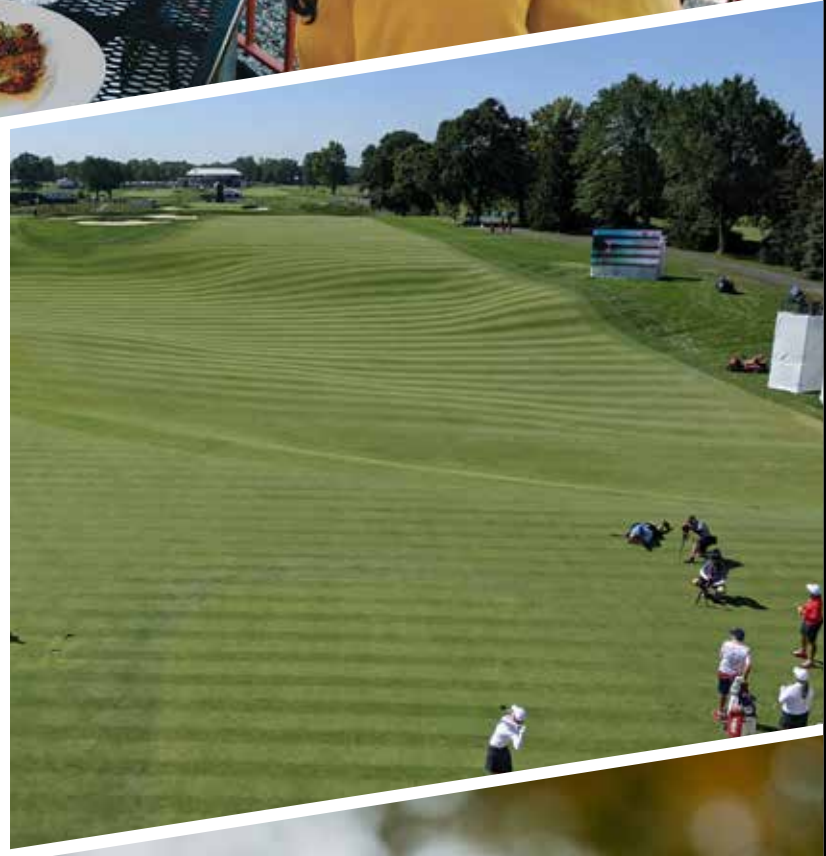

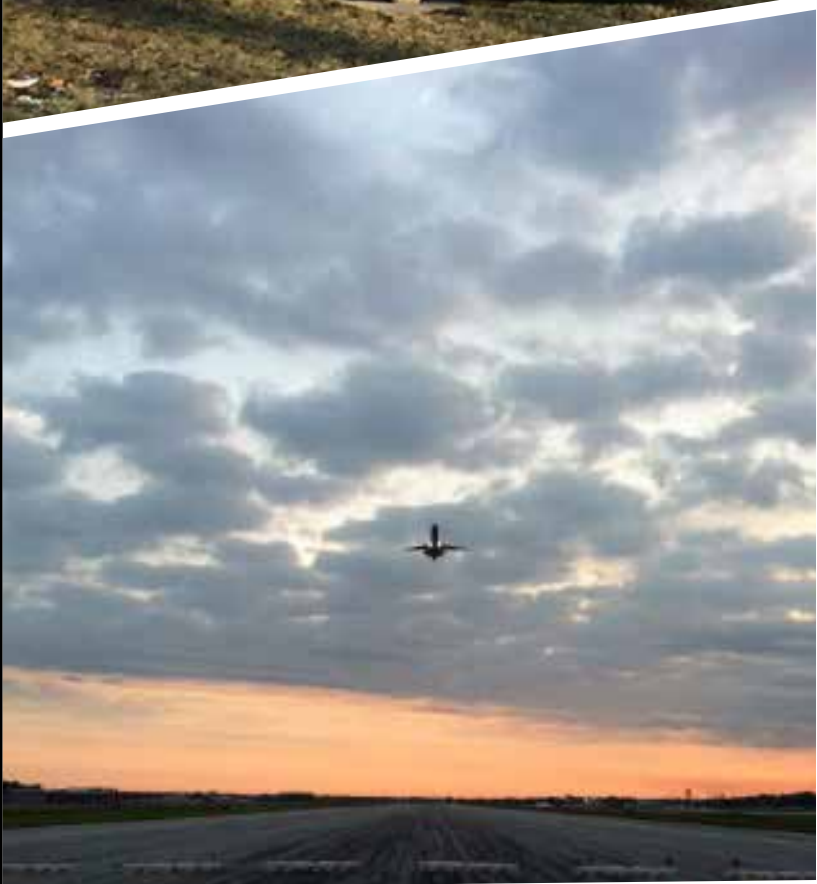




The Position

This is a highly visible, highly responsible position directing the activities of and providing leadership for the Eugene F. Kranz Toledo Express Airport and Toledo Executive Airport. Under the direction of the Port Authority President & CEO and serving as a member of the Port Authority executive leadership team, the Airport Director oversees development of the Airports and associated facilities, including capital improvement and maintenance programs. The Airport Director is responsible for ensuring the safety, services and activities of the Airports, in compliance with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations to include 14, CFR Parts 77 and 139. He or she promotes and manages airport property and interacts with a wide range of customers, both internal and external. The Director works with fixed-base operators and the Ohio Air National Guard, as well as corporate tenants, cargo and maintenance operators and educational program providers. He or she promotes as well as manages airport property and represents the Port Authority in all aviation matters. The Airport Director researches, identifies and seeks federal, state and local grants in order to develop Airport facilities and maintain their safety and efficiency. Development and implementation of the Airports' operating and capital budgets and directing all financial management activities are essential to this position, as well as developing innovative ideas for using the Airports.





The Ideal Candidate

The ideal candidate for this position will hold a Bachelor's degree in Airport Management, Engineering, Finance, Public or Business Administration or a related field, possess an Accredited Airport Executive (A.A.E.) or Certified Member (C.M.) certification from the American Association of Airport Executives, and have 8 or more years' experience in managing an airport or airport function, including 3 years' supervisory experience in an airport-related field. The Airport Director must have knowledge of the principles and techniques of airport operations and maintenance, including FAA Part 139, airline operations, general aviation operations, airport security and safety and industry standards. He or she must have knowledge of airport leases, operating agreements, and all federal, state and local funding programs. A strong knowledge of the air transportation industry, including business standards and leasing policies, is required, along with current and proposed federal and state aviation legislation, rules and regulations. The Airport Director must be a team player who can work with others and a self-starter who can set and consistently meet set deadlines. Additionally, the Airport Director must be able to establish and maintain effective working relationships with internal and external customers, community organizations, federal state and local agencies, Port Authority management, staff, tenants and contractors, and the public.

Salary and Compensation

The salary range for this position is \$130,000 - \$148,000 with an attractive benefits package.
