

The Airport

Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport (MSY) is the gateway to one of the most exciting cities in the world – New Orleans, legendary for its history, food and good times. New Orleans Aviation Board

The Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport is governed by the New Orleans Aviation Board (NOAB), which was created in 1943 to oversee the administration, operation, and maintenance of the new airport. The Board represents the City in all aviation matters in consultation with state, national, and international government agencies. It is an unattached board under the executive branch of the New Orleans City Government.

All members of the Board are appointed by the Mayor of New Orleans with the approval of the City Council. The terms are for five years, and they serve without compensation. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected annually by the other Board members.

Architecture and Culture


New Orleans, with its richly mottled old buildings, its sly, sophisticated - sometimes almost disreputable - air, and its Hispanic-Gallic traditions, has more the flavor of an old European capital than an American city. Townhouses in the French Quarter, with their courtyards and carriageways, are thought by some scholars to be related on a small scale to certain Parisian "hotels" - princely urban residences of the 17th and 18th centuries.


Visitors particularly remember the decorative cast-iron balconies that cover many of these townhouses like ornamental filigree cages. European influence is also seen in the city's famous above-ground cemeteries. The practice of interring people in large, richly adorned aboveground tombs dates from the period when New Orleans was under Spanish rule. These hugely popular "cities of the dead" have been and continue to be an item of great interest to visitors. Mark Twain, noting that New Orleanians did not have conventional below-ground burials, quipped that "few of the living complain and none of the others."

One of the truly amazing aspects of New Orleans architecture is the sheer number of historic homes and buildings per square mile. Orleanians never seem to replace anything. Consider this: Uptown, the City's largest historic district, has almost 11,000 buildings, 82 percent of which were built before 1935 - truly a "time warp."

Food and Dining

In New Orleans, at breakfast we discuss lunch and at lunch we discuss what's for dinner. We are a city that loves to eat and appreciates food. 
Sports



The Position

The Deputy Director of Aviation - Finance and Administration is responsible for planning, organizing and directing the Aviation Board's financial and business management activities including budgeting, accounting, financial reporting, payroll, asset control, debt issuance, debt management, and airline rate analysis and calculation. Additionally, this position directs Purchasing, Accounting, IT, Concessions and Human Resources staff. The Deputy Director is responsible for:

- Maintaining all financial records for the Board and preparing fiscal and administrative reports on the Airport's status.
- Directing the preparation of financial data and reports needed in tenant contract and lease negotiations and participating in those negotiations as needed.
- Monitoring outstanding debt, establishing guidelines for debt issuance.
- Supervising the Airport's cash management including invoicing, collections, cash needs projections and preparation and evaluation of cash flow analysis.
- Managing the Airport's information technology systems, as well as supervising its human resource functions including hiring, payroll and benefits programs.
- Working with outside agencies, including city, state and federal agencies to ensure compliance with governmental guidelines and requirements.
- Managing contract administration activities including Requests for Proposals/Qualifications, ensuring compliance with established processes, as well as local, state and federal laws.
- Managing the development and implementation of the department's policies and procedures as well as development of fee schedules for aviation services in compliance with federal, state and city rules and regulations.





Preferred Education and Experience

- 4-year degree in Business or Public Administration, Accounting or a related field.
- Master's degree in a relevant field.
- 5 years' progressively responsible experience in airport management.
- 5 years' direct supervisory experience.
- Strong understanding of aviation industry standards and protocols.
- Thorough knowledge of the principles of organization management, public and governmental accounting practices and controls, municipal bonding, cash flow and budgeting.
- An equivalent combination of related experience and education will be considered.
- Demonstrated ability to interact effectively with all levels of staff, as well as Local, State and Federal government representatives.
- Ability to pass a criminal background check as required by the Transportation Security Administration.
