

About the Organization

Charlotte operates under a council-manager form of government. The Mayor and City Council are responsible for making policy decisions for the community. The City Manager is responsible for carrying out those decisions, as well as providing vision and leadership to the organization and overseeing the daily operations of city government. Within the City Manager's office, there are five deputy city managers that oversee various departments. City leaders are strategic in managing operations effectively and in alignment with the policy objectives set by the City Council.

The city's focus areas are good-paying jobs, affordable homes, mobility and sustainability in addition to maintaining a safe community and well-managed government that prioritizes these essentials. The organization has also maintained an AAA bond rating.

The City of Charlotte has nearly 9,000 employees across 19 departments who serve nearly one million residents. City employees thrive because of strong support from leadership, training opportunities, special recognition and upward mobility in a high-morale work environment. The City of Charlotte offers competitive compensation and benefits for its employees. Employees can take advantage of wellness incentives, resource networks, pre-paid tuition assistance, and learning and development opportunities. 



Community Overview

Charlotte is the 14th largest city in the U.S. and the largest city in the State of North Carolina. Also known as the Queen City, Charlotte and its resident county, Mecklenburg, are named for Queen Charlotte of Mecklenburg-Strelitz, the queen consort of British King George III during the time of the city's founding.

More than 943,000 residents call Charlotte home, and the metro population totals more than 2.9 million. The city is still growing rapidly, currently ranking as the sixth-fastest growing city in the country. On average, 157 people are moving to the Charlotte region each day, according to a Charlotte Regional Business Alliance report. Charlotte is also among the most diverse large cities with 18% of residents born in a foreign country.

Charlotte is ranked 8th on the U.S. News & World Report's Best Big Cities for 2025-2026. Though it's a big city, Charlotte still has a small town, southern feel. From historic Dilworth to lively South End, family-friendly Ballantyne to artsy NoDa, there are communities for every lifestyle. This includes more than 30 A+neighborhoods.

Charlotte ranks as one of the top 10 most livable U.S. cities and top 50 in the world, according to the Economist's Intelligence Unit's 2025 rankings. The city also has a lower cost of living compared to many of its peer metro areas such as New York, Washington, San Francisco and Atlanta.

Charlotte is home to 19 Fortune 1000 companies including Bank of America, Honeywell, Truist, Lowe's, Duke Energy and major operations for Wells Fargo. Charlotte is the second-largest U.S. banking center and continues to attract large and small businesses from every industry by generating economic growth opportunities and building strategic partnerships. The Queen City is also ranked among the top 20 U.S. cities for business travel. Our airport, Charlotte Douglas International, is a global hub ranking as the sixth busiest airport in the world and offering direct flights to over 180 destinations.

Charlotte is a major hub for sports, with the NFL's Carolina Panthers, the NBA's Charlotte Hornets, MLS' Charlotte FC, the USL W League's Carolina Ascent, the NASCAR Hall of Fame, the PGA's Truist Championship and the U.S. National Whitewater Center. For those who are not sports enthusiasts, the city boasts several arts and culture attractions including Blumenthal Performing Arts, the Mint Museum, the Harvey B. Gantt Center, Charlotte Symphony, and a thriving music scene. There's always something fun and exciting to experience. The city's vibrant food scene offers a wide variety of local and international cuisine that is guaranteed to satisfy any craving. The area is also known for producing beer and wine.

Position Overview

The City of Charlotte and Mecklenburg County seek a Director of Planning, Design and Development to provide strategic leadership for integrated planning services across both jurisdictions. This executive role oversees initiatives that guide land development, preserve the community tree canopy, strengthen entitlement services, support design and historic preservation, advance long-range planning, and shape regional transportation strategies. Working with a 14-member appointed Planning Commission, the Director plays a vital role in aligning staff and elected officials on planning and zoning matters to ensure the region's growth is thoughtful, inclusive, and sustainable.

About the Role

The Director serves as the chief strategist for planning, design, and development services. This leader directs the implementation of the City's Comprehensive Plan and Unified Development Ordinance, ensuring future updates and amendments reflect community needs and regulatory best practices. The position requires extensive collaboration with the community, developers, contractors, neighborhood and business groups, advisory boards, and elected leaders to maintain alignment and transparency on development issues.

- Provide strategic direction for planning, zoning, permitting, design, historic preservation, tree canopy policies, and regional transportation planning
- Oversee development and monitoring of departmental goals, metrics, and performance standards
- Lead the implementation of the City's Comprehensive Plan and Unified Development Ordinance
- Ensure high-quality customer service and efficient development review processes
- Direct departmental budget preparation and performance monitoring
- Support effective community engagement through best practices






